Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra

Kendriya Hindi Sansthan (Central Institute of Hindi) is an autonomous organization under the Ministry of Education, Government of India. It is dedicated to the teaching, research and promotion of Hindi across the globe. The headquarter of the institute located in Agra (Uttar Pradesh), is spread over 15 acres and houses modern infrastructure including academic blocks, hostels, an international auditorium, guest house, and residential quarters. The idea for its establishment emerged on 15 March 1951 during the All-India Cultural Conference at the Red Fort under the guidance of Dr. Rajendra Prasad, the first President of India. Following this, Akhil Bhartiya Hindi Parishad was set up in Agra in 1952. In 1953, Akhil Bhartiya Hindi Prashikshan Mahavidyalaya was established under the supervision of this Parishad. On 19 March 1960, the Ministry of Education took over the Mahavidyalaya and entrusted its functions to the Kendriya Hindi Shikshan Mandal, chaired by Hon'ble Padma Bhushan Dr. Moturi Satyanarayan. The Mandal registered under the Societies Registration Act on 1 November 1960, renamed the Mahavidyalaya as Kendriya Hindi Shikshak Mahavidyalaya in 1963, and later, on 21 October 1963, as Kendriya Hindi Sansthan.

Guided by Article 351 of the Constitution of India, the Institute works to promote Hindi as a Pan Indian language, improve teaching standards, train teachers, prepare and publish textbooks, and facilitate advanced study in Hindi language, literature, and comparative linguistics. It publishes research-oriented books, journals, and magazines, collaborates with similar institutions, and provides fellowships, scholarships, awards, and medals. The Sansthan operates eight regional centres across the country in Delhi, Hyderabad, Guwahati, Shillong, Mysore, Dimapur, Bhubaneswar, and Ahmedabad conducting various courses and orientation programmes for teachers, students, and foreign learners. Its founder, Shri Moturi Satyanarayan, hailed from a non-Hindi speaking state, symbolizing the role of Hindi as a unifying link for national integration.



Call for Papers

Professionals are invited to submit their original contributions based on research surveys, practices, theoretical and empirical research, or case studies related to the theme or sub-themes of the conference. All submissions will undergo a review process by a panel of experts, and accepted papers will be published in the conference volume with an ISBN.

The full-text papers should be sent to the editor at paperilakhs.2026@gmail.com on or before 15th November 2025, accompanied by a Demand Draft, multi-city cheque, or NEFT/RTGS payment of ₹1000 (Rupees one thousand only) for a copy of the Conference Proceedings.

Guidelines for Paper Submission

Originality: Submissions must be original and not previously published or under consideration elsewhere.

Plagiarism and AI-generated content must be strictly less than 10%; otherwise, the paper will not be accepted.

Language: All papers must be submitted either in English or in Hindi. Papers in Hindi should be in Unicode.

Formatting

- **Length:** Maximum 3,500 words (including abstract, references, tables, and figures).
- **Font:** Times New Roman in english and unicode in hindi, size 12pt.
- **Line Spacing:** 1.5 lines.
- **Margins:** 1 inch on all sides.
- **Abstract:** A concise abstract of 200 words, summarizing the paper's objectives, methodology, key findings, and conclusions. Include 3–5 keywords.
- **Referencing:** Use APA 7th edition style for citations and references.
- **Anonymity:** For blind peer review, ensure your submission does not contain any author-identifying information.
- **Submission Format:** Papers must be submitted in Microsoft Word (.docx) format.

Accommodation Guidelines

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
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

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HOW TO REACH Kendriya Hindi Sansthan, Agra

Agra is a historic city located in the state of Uttar Pradesh, India. It is situated on the banks of the Yamuna River and is world-famous for its rich history, cultural heritage, and architectural marvels such as the Taj Mahal, Agra Fort, and Fatehpur Sikri. Agra covers an area of approximately 188 square kilometers (73 square miles) and attracts millions of visitors every year from across the globe.

By Air



The nearest airport to Agra is Pandit Deen Dayal Upadhyay Airport, Agra (AGR), which has limited flight connectivity. The nearest major international airport is Indira Gandhi International Airport, New Delhi (DEL), about 220 km away. From Delhi, one can reach Agra by train, bus, or taxi.

By Train



Agra is well-connected by rail and has major railway stations like Agra Cantt, Agra Fort, and Raja Ki Mandi. Several superfast and express trains operate from Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Kolkata, and other cities. From Agra Cantt railway station, KHS is approximately 11 km away and can be reached by taxi or auto rickshaw.

By Bus



Agra is connected to major cities via Yamuna Expressway (from Delhi) and NH-19 (from Kanpur, Lucknow, Varanasi, etc.). Regular UPSRTC and private buses operate between Agra and Delhi, Jaipur, Lucknow, and other nearby cities. KHS campus is located in Hindi Sansthan Marg, Agra, and is easily accessible by local transport, taxi, or auto rickshaw.

Local Transport Options

- Auto-rickshaws and E-rickshaws are widely available for short distances.
- App-based taxis (Ola, Uber) and prepaid taxi counters at railway stations provide convenient options.
- E-rickshaws & cycle-rickshaws can be used for nearby commuting inside the city.
